Preamble

This report details the activities of the Department of Community Services and Tourism for the months of July and August 2022.

General

After struggling in the early summer with staffing, July and August saw the start of the remainder of our summer students, and staff quickly recovered lost time and had the full department operating smoothly in the first weeks of July. The remainder of the summer was spent maintaining parks and tourism resources, completing projects, providing youth programming and operating the Tourist Information Center. The summer was one of the busiest that we have experienced in several years, with an influx of tourists from southern Ontario post-COVID using our parks and facilities to their fullest.

Capital Projects

MMCC Upgrades 2022

Two portions of this project are complete and on budget: the tube heaters and arena sound system were both completed this summer.

The remaining two portions of the project – the flooring in the South hallway and the Curling glycol pump have been delayed due to supply chain issues. Both items are now expected to be completed in October.

Community Events and Recreation

Recreation Coordinator's Report:

Science North was at the MMCC for a week at the end of July and start of August with their "Climate Change" Exhibit.

Seniors Solution Council Meetings were on hold for the summer, but we joined in some planning for the Seniors Expo being held in September.

Danielle Hughes joined us for July and August as the Summer Recreation Student providing drop in programs two times per week. Programs included beach volley ball, soccer, arts and crafts, pickleball etc.

We collaborated with CanMexicanus and held: 1-week full day day camp at the MMCC 1-week half day day camp held at the MMCC

A four- week Youth Soccer program is being held in September, with approximately 50 youth signed up.

Canada Day – July 1 was a great success, with a bike parade, vendors, Climb'N Fun. An estimate of 700 people attended the event.

Goose Nest Committee Coordination and advertising. Committee meetings are held monthly, and markets are being held every second Thursday in the summer. We hope to increase the variety of vendors as well as increase participation/visitation.

A recreation registration night was held on August 24, to assist community organizations with increasing participant numbers in their programs.

Planning is underway for the Fall Fair. 30 vendors have registered as well as Science North 'Great Northern Roadshow' will be joining the festivities. A movie night in the park will be held at dusk on September 10.

Pick-Up Pickleball was available in the arena on Tuesday and Thursday afternoons, and had an average attendance of approximately 4 people per session. August weather allowed more to play outside, with the new wind screens providing a more suitable location for outdoor play.

Fitness session planning for September has started, we are looking for to increase the variety of classes.

Fall Scheduling for the MMCC is well under way, with deadlines approaching fast for the User Groups.

Other Projects

WSIB Health and Safety Excellence Program

Staff of the JHSC have been working on the WSIB Excellence Program. This program offers a rebate to WSIB premiums for organizations that complete key milestones in their health and safety program. To that end, the JHSC has reviewed and recommended an updated health and safety policy for adoption by Council as well as added several Standards to the municipal health and safety program.

Funding and Grants

MMCC Funding Application – NOHFC

Staff completed a NOHFC application for the MMCC as outlined in the last monthly report. Staff are currently working with the NOHFC funding officer to determine best fit for their funding programs as well as provide them with additional information upon request.

MMCC Sports Field Track Application – Trillium

Staff have once again applied to OTF for the renewal of the MMCC Running Track. This round, staff focused on the importance of the track for hosting regional school events, both as an economic driver of our community as well as a piece of infrastructure with great social importance to our community. The application was based on the last 2 and reuesd proposed methods, including the replacement of the old sinter track with another granular material, as well as the replacement of the base of the track to ensure we don't have similar issues which we are currently facing with a lack of foundation to the surface.






